

•1946 – first
Ontario-wide
youth retreat, Port
Rowan planned by
Ontario Youth
Organization
(OYO)

•1957 – start of twice a year OYO retreats, with summer retreat at Chesley



1959 – first boys' camp at Chesley; 1960 – first week of girls' camp


### ... initiated by Ontario Mennonite Youth




1960 – OYO inspection of the Silver Lake site

•May 20 – fire •May 25 – board decided to rebuild same structure •June 1 – lumber arrived •June 8 – 25 volunteers start work on kitchen •June 15 – kitchen closed •June 21 – stove and propane installed •June 22 – windows & doors installed •June 29 – campers arrive

The compression ring that holds everything together was welded by John Rogalsky in his back yard. The neighbours thought he must be building a fall-out shelter. – Cathy Paetkau



(started in 1986 and finished in 1992 – before the age of everything instant internet ☺)




# **2011 fire** Dining hall
