Summer 2022

Despite it being my fifth year on staff, I experienced a lot of personal firsts this summer. I conquered my fear of heights by getting certified to run camp's climbing wall. I lead CILTs and Program for the first time, and held a maintenance role for one week (in which I also lead last-minute crafts and climbing sessions. It was a wild week). In more mundane news, I also mopped the kitchen for the very first time in my five years on staff— which might sound ridiculous, but in my defence, I mostly worked as a counsellor and in the kitchen in my first and second years, and years 3 and 4 were almost entirely online for me.

I was far from the only one gaining new skills this summer. Between the continued launch of the new off-site day camps and a more “back to normal” delivery of overnight/on-site camps and out-trips, it was a summer of much learning, adaptation and positive change. We had a record number of staff and almost certainly a record number of Staff Orientation sessions, which included, for the first time (in my memory at least), designated sessions every day for small groups of staff to practice running resource sessions with each other. For those of us who have been at Silver Lake before, it was amazing what seemingly small and obvious aspects of camp's daily routines needed to be relearned after being mostly away for two years. Simple things like knowing all the tips and tricks to ensure a smooth dishwashing run. Knowing all the words, much less harmonies, to campfire songs. Especially in the first couple of weeks, many things come together at the last minute, chaos reigned at times, and silly mistakes happened. Through it all was a definite sense of joy and gratefulness to be back in the wonderful and supportive environment that is Silver Lake, working alongside so many fantastic and talented people. It was a summer filled with learning, for first-year and returning staff alike, and it warms my heart to know that camp is in good hands going forward.




